Call to Order

T. Angelloz called the meeting to order at approximately 10:30 A.M and asked the committee to review the meeting minutes from the previous meeting.

D. Rome motioned to approve the meeting minutes from the June 13, 2018 meeting, A. Chaisson seconded the motion. Motion passed.

C. Parker updated the Safety IO partners on the LA 3040 Feasibility Study. Currently, LA Department of Transportation and Development's contract section is preparing the contract. Once that is completed, it will be sent out for signatures.

C. Parker stated that Lafourche Parish has submitted an application requesting thermoplastic striping and signage for a total of 11 local roads: Choctaw Road, Talbot Avenue, Triple Oaks Drive, Saint Charles By-Pass Road, Sanchez Road, Industrial Park Road, Saint Phillips Street, Lefort Bypass Road, Parish Road, Laurel Valley Road and Burma Road. She explained that these roadways were identified in the Local Technical Assistance Program's (LTAP's) Local Road Safety Plan screening process for Lafourche. Thermoplastic Striping and signage were identified as effective countermeasures for crash type. C. Parker also informed the committee that SCPDC staff is also working on an application with Terrebonne Parish staff and staff in the City of Thibodaux on similar project proposals.

C. Parker and J. Manning then reviewed items pertaining to the Local Road Safety Plans. C. Parker reminded the committee that SCPDC staff will be working with each parish on safety plans for their area. J. Manning reviewed data, methodology, and prioritization of projects for Lafourche, Terrebonne and the City of Thibodaux. C. Parker requested a motion to proceed with data, prioritization of projects and methodology. She stated that Road Safety Assessments will be scheduled at the next meeting.

C. Pulaski motioned to proceed with the Local Road Safety Plans using the data, prioritization of projects and methodology provided. A. Lefort seconded the motion. Motion passed.

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Partner reports were given:

Lt. Doug Chauvin, Terrebonne Parish Sheriff's Office, requested DOTD's assistance with the speed in front of Grand Calliou Middle School. LADOTD District 02 stated that they would conduct a speed study.

Captain Bobbie O'Bryan, Houma Police Department, updated the committee on the Camera Pilot Program to improve safety in Terrebonne Parish communities. He stated that they are searching for funds to continue this program. He also stated that a street light report was submitted to the parish which detailed that over 1,000 lights were out throughout the parish.

A Lefort motioned to adjourn the meeting, D. Rome seconded the motion. Motion passed.

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LOUISIANA STRATEGIC HIGHWAY SAFETY PLAN


